Junior Programmes

Easter Camp 2010

Children are invited to sign up for a one, two, three or four day course which will combine golf tuition and fun games with the SNAG equipment. Participants will even have the opportunity to play a few holes of "real golf" on the 9-hole Wee Monty academy course. Classes will take place on 4th to 7th April inclusive and from 11th to 14th April inclusive, from 9.00am to 1.00pm. Each class will be supervised by a PGA Teaching Professional.

Cost BD30 per day or sign up for four days for just BD105

Mini Masters Junior Development Programme (JDP)

This is an 6-week course with classes held either on Friday or Saturday mornings. The programme, which is suited to children aged between 5 and 16, includes a 60-minute group lesson each week and the use of all equipment. A special Junior Academy golf tournament is held at the conclusion of the programme on the par 3 Academy course and this is followed by a barbecue and the presentation of a certificate of achievement to each participant.

Cost: BD60

Tiny Tigers SNAG (Starting New at Golf) Academy

This 6-week course is also held either on Friday or Saturday mornings and makes use of the SNAG coaching system. Again, the participants will take place in a fun Tiny Tigers golf tournament at the end of the programme and will be presented with a certificate of achievement at the barbecue afterwards.

Cost: BD60

The above prices include tuition, the use of all equipment, a golf shirt, golf tournament, barbecue and activity booklets

SNAG (Starting New at Golf) is an integrated system which allows playing, teaching and learning while having fun. The system contains all the basic elements of golf but in a modified form. The SNAG ball has a limited distance with the average player hitting it a maximum of 50 yards. SNAG has only two clubs: one to hit, pitch and chip the ball, called the Launcher and the other one being putter like, called the Roller. All shots other than putting are played off a small rubber mat and tee called the Launch Pad. The targets are Velcro-covered allowing the ball to stick when a successful shot is played.
